# CBC's Youth & Children's Ministry



One of the most quoted verses in youth ministry is 1 Timothy 4:12 ***“Don’t let anyone look down on you because you are young, but set an example for the believers in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith and in purity”*** (NIV). For many youth leaders, this is the verse we want our youth to live by. In it, the Apostle Paul not only commands young people to reject a culture that looks down on them because they’re young, but he also challenges them to be examples to fellow believers in every area of their Christian lives. That is a good expectation to have of any believer and we want to see our teens grabbing hold of that high standard, taking responsibility to do, to act, and to lead. The problem comes when we as adults or leaders set a lower expectation for our teens by labeling them as “good kids” for all the bad stuff they don’t do instead of the good things they do. It sends the wrong message to our teens. It tells them the bar is set low on what they can accomplish as Christians. Because they are allowed to define themselves by the world’s standards of what they can’t do, they never learn what they are capable of through Jesus Christ. So we are going to raise the expectations on each of us. Not to what I think they should be or what mom and dad think they should be, but to what the teens know they can be through Jesus Christ. Ask yourself, what would we be capable of as a church, if we trusted God more, dreamed big, and raised our expectations?

## CORN MAZE

Saturday, October 12 at 2:00, we are going to the Wayside Farm in Berryville, VA, for the 10 acre corn maze and pumpkin patch. This is open to youth, children, families, and anyone who would like to attend. Children and younger youth must be chaperoned through the corn maze. The cost is \$10 per person and children under the age of 2 are free. Pumpkins can be purchased for .50 cents per pound and the farm has snacks for sale. Calvary is such a generous church! In so many ways you show your generosity.

One way you demonstrate generosity is allowing outside groups to use the building; for example: Bible Study Fellowship on Tuesday evenings (a great women’s Bible study group that meets on Tuesday nights if you’re interested), Iglesia Bautista de el Buen Pastor (a Latino church that meets in the chapel on Sunday afternoon – the name means: Good Shepherd Baptist Church), and the Classical Cottage School (classes for home-schooled children that meet during the daytime on Thursdays and Fridays, September through May – they describe themselves this way: “a consortium of professional educators that focuses on developing essential skills using classical methods”).

Another indication of your generosity: Calvary encourages children from other congregations to send their children to our Wednesday night AWANA program. Several churches take advantage of this service. Also, we try to include the Latino church that meets on Sunday afternoons in as many of our events as we can (baptisms, youth trips, fellowship and social events, etc.).

One more way Calvary is generous takes place every October when we collect the Harvest offering. It is a special offering to support various ministries, missions, and needs that the Stewardship Committee selects. Please read the separate article elsewhere in this newsletter.

And finally, you have another chance to show your generous nature at the Quarterly Business Meeting on October 23. In that meeting you will hear from the Stewardship Committee’s Parker Fund Sub-committee regarding its ongoing work to determine how we will use the Paul and Frances Parker bequest that has been coming to the church for several years. The final distribution has arrived and it’s time to begin making decisions. The first decision will be regarding a tithe of the gift. **PARKER BEQUEST TITHE PROPOSAL**

We want to properly honor the Parkers by referring to the gift as the Paul & Frances Parker Bequest.

The final disbursement arrived last month bringing the total of the gift to \$1,295,277.58. Join us as we praise God for the generosity of the Parker family.

Also join us in praying for wisdom in how to respond to their generosity.

The Stewardship Committee formed a sub-committee to make recommendations for the use of the gift. We recommend the church should first honor the memory of the Parkers, set an example to the church and community, and build the Kingdom by giving away a tenth of the gift – \$129,527.76. We asked the church to help decide what ministries should benefit from the proposed tithe. The following reflects the results of the recent surveys.
