## CHILDREN'S CHURCH REVAMP

For many years, Calvary Baptist has offered Children's Church every Sunday for Kindergarten through Third grade. Our intention has always been to enrich the spiritual life of our children. To maintain that enrichment as our primary goal, we are making changes to Children's Church.

Beginning in September, Calvary Kid's Church will now be held once a month on the last Sunday of the month for Kindergarten through Third grade only. Fourth graders will stay in the service with their parents and Fifth graders are eligible to be helpers.

There are several reasons for this. The first is to make Kid's Church an event separate from their Sunday School experience every week. The second reason is it enables the workers who are dedicated to serving as the leaders in Kid's Church to worship with their families and not experience burn out. The third and most important reason is it allows Kid's Church to foster spiritual growth and not be child care during the service for elementary age children. This is a change to Kid's Church and not nursery coverage. We will still have baby and preschool nursery every Sunday.

We will begin a new Kid's Church curriculum called "Discipletown: How to follow God's Plan". The first lesson in the series will be God's Plan for the world. We are establishing the policy of having fourth graders wait a year before they can be helpers so they can learn what it means to participate in regular church. Fifth graders who want to help can volunteer to be put in the rotation to assist the leaders.

I know this is a lot to take in and it will be an adjustment having your children with you in the service. It is my hope that this is the start of a fresh movement to make our kid's worship experience more relatable and fruitful. As always, if you have any questions please feel free to contact me.

## PARKER ENDOWMENT UPDATE

Our church, through the generosity of [name] and Frances Parker, received a wonderful gift, and with the final distribution last month it totals nearly \$1.25 million. The church made some decisions regarding this gift and now the time has come for more decisions. The Stewardship Committee established a three person subcommittee to provide recommendations on distribution. That subcommittee has been hard at work.

We have decided the first priority is to tithe this gift back to the Lord's service. Acts 1:8 tells us, "and you shall be witnesses of Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." We will recommend a tithe be given of the total amount of funds from the Parker Estate at the local, state, national, and international levels. Within each of these major areas we have discussed specific organizations as potential recipients.

We realize that we are not in this alone. You, the congregation of Calvary Baptist Church, will support this. We are asking that you assist the subcommittee in determining both the percentage for distribution among the four categories as well as the specific organizations to receive gifts.

On Sunday, September 8, we'll ask for your input in a way that will energize your thinking. When completed, we will know the percentage of the tithe that will be distributed among the local, state, national, and international divisions.

Then on Sunday, September 22, we will ask for input as to which local, state, national, and international organizations will benefit from the tithe.

By the Quarterly Business Meeting on October 23, we will present for vote of concurrence the results of the tallies taken on those two Sundays. After the vote is taken and recorded, the subcommittee intends to conduct an open discussion of the best use of the remaining money, what we are calling the body of the Parker Endowment.
